To provide oral health checkup for the villagers and educate them regarding their oral health status

8. <u>Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities</u> <u>undertaken</u>

The Department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University organized an oral health screening & treatment program on 8th February 2022 at Village Noorgarh, Pataudi. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Sachin Chand (Associate Professor), Dr. Vipul (Post graduate-Endodontics), Dr. Kirti (Post graduate – Prosthodontics) along with 6 Interns (Nikhil, Nayanika, Manya, Mallika, Nikita & Nancy) and 2 Attendants Mr. Sunil & Mr. Rajmumar. The camp started at 11:45am and continued till 2:30 pm. During the outreach activity, 51 patients were examined out of which 18 were provided dental treatment in the mobile dental van which included 17 scaling & 1 extraction. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University for further procedures. Oral Health Education was imparted regarding the importance of adopting a healthy lifestyle through brushing techniques, models and charts. The session was concluded by giving oral health education speech to the participated people. The purpose of the Oral Health talk was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health care.

9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

Beneficiaries were residents of Village Noorgarh, Pataudi from all age groups. Total population of the village was approximately 2200 which include 1200 males & 1000 females. There are 2 schools in the village. Main occupation of the



villagers is agriculture and job.

Total people examined: 51 out of which 26 were males and 25 were females. 18 were provided treatment in the mobile dental van. Majority of the patients had periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis & dental caries.

10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the residents of village noorgarh. 51 people were examined out of which 18 were given treatment in mobile dental van. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University for further procedures The Interns and Post graduates worked in tandem and learnt the nuances of working at a rural setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management at a rural oral health programme.

The Dental team was headed by Dr. Shikha Sharma(Senior Lecturer Department of Periodontology) along with intern Preeti Yadav and 1 Attendant Mr Sombir. During the outreach activity, 22 patients were examined, out of which 11were male and 11 females. Patients were thoroughly examined and guided according to the treatment requirement. Patients requiring treatment were referred to SGT University for further procedures. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated to all. The purpose of the Oral Health check-up was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health care

9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:



Younger population had Dental Caries Predominantly. A fragment of population was of tobacco chewers who were separately motivated for quitting the habit.




10. Outcome of the Activity & its relevance to Health Sciences:



8. <u>Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities</u> <u>undertaken</u>

The department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University organized an oral health screening and treatment program on February 15, 2022 at Kankori village, Gurugram collaborating with publicity team SGTU, Medical Superintendent, SGT Medical Hospital & Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences SGT University.

The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Charu Khurana (Assistant Professor), along with 1 Intern Ms. Prerna Sahrawat and 1 Attendants (Mr. Sunil). The dental camp started at 10:30 am and continued till 2:00 pm.

During the Outreach activity, Oral health status of villagers were examined. The team imparted the importance of oral health, routine oral hygiene instructions to people and also demonstrated brushing techniques. Dental team also made people aware about consequences of tobacco consumption and motivated tobacco users to quit tobacco for a healthy lifestyle.

The villagers expressed gratitude for the visit and pledged to take care of their oral hygiene habits in future.

Total patients examined: 45 Males: 18 Females: 27

10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

Around 30 patients were referred to SGT dental hospital for their further treatment procedures. Organizing such outreach activities helps to reach to the individuals living in remote areas and suffering from oral diseases. This dental camp provided information and created awareness in the community and also motivated patients to get themselves treated and lead a healthy life.

The Department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University conducted oral health screening and treatment program on 16th February 2022 at village Basunda in association with SGT Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr Abhinav Bhargava along with 4 Postgraduates Dr Shelly (Endodontics), Dr Komal (Prosthodontics), Dr Alisha (Periodontics) and Dr Garima (Oral Surgery) and 5 Interns Priyanka, Pooja Verma, Pooja Yadav, Ranika and Preeti Yadav) and 2 attendants Mr Sombir and Mr Rajkumar. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Conservative Dentistry and Endodontics, Prosthodontics Periodontics and Oral Surgery. 41 patients were examined out of which 13 were provided dental treatment in the mobile dental van (11 Oral Prophylaxis 1 Restoration and 1 Extraction). Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University for further procedures. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave positive feedback and appreciated the check up and patient care provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion The interns and postgraduates appreciated the opportunity provided to them to work in an outreach location and experiencing the working of mobile dental van and expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future. The purpose of the Oral Health check-up was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health.




periodontitis. Younger population had Dental Caries Predominantly. A fragment of population was of tobacco chewers who were separately motivated for quitting the habit.


10. Outcome of the Activity & its relevance to Health Sciences:




9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents of Bhimgarh Kheri village, Gurugram, from all age groups. The working population is primarily engaged in agriculture. Fortypeople including seven children, came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 20 were males and 20 were females. Both adults and children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had dental caries and periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Many old-aged people complained about missing teeth and were willing to get replaced with prosthesis. Majority of child patients reported with early childhood caries.

10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the people of Bhimgarh Kheri Village. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate the population regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance, which created an interest among the population, especially children. Forty patients were examined andfifteen patients were treated in the mobile dental van and others were motivated to get the required treatment done from SGT Dental College and Hospital.
