### 7. Objective of the Activity:

To create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health, provide oral health check-up and basic dental

treatment in Mobile Dental Van andreferral of complex treatment cases to SGTDental Hospital.

## 8. <u>Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities</u> undertaken

An oral health screening and treatment camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University on 23<sup>rd</sup>March 2022 at village Aklimpur, Sohna, Gurugram in association with SGT Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Tanvi Bhardwai (Senior Lecturer) along with one faculty Dr. Raghu ( Conservative and Endodontics), Three post-graduate students, Dr. Taruna (Pedodontics), Dr. Poonam (Prosthodontics) and Dr. Pratishtha (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery), 4 interns, Nancy, Mallika, Nayanika, Manya and 2 attendants, Mr. Sunil and Mr. Rajkumar. Total 59 patients were examined and 19 patients were treated in Mobile Dental Van. SGT University which included 16scalings, 2restoration and 1extraction. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave a positivefeedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were content with the treatment provided in the camp. The interns and other dental specialists appreciated the opportunity provided to them to work in an outreach location and expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future.

### 9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents of Aklimpur village, Gurugram, from all age groups. The working population is primarily engaged in service. Fifty Nine people including eleven children, came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 20 were males and 39 were females. Both adults and children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had dental caries and periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Many old-aged people complained about missing teeth and were willing to get replaced with prosthesis. Children reported with dental caries and orthodontic issues. A few patients were tobacco consumers and were given cessation counselling.



### 10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the people of Aklimpur Village. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate the population regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance, which created an interest among the population, especially children. Tobacco Cessation Counselling was given to tobacco users. Fifty Nine patients were examined andnineteen patients were treated in the mobile dental van and others were motivated to get the required treatment done from SGT Dental College and Hospital. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Conservative and Endodontics, Pedodontics, Prosthodontics and Oral Surgery.15 patients reported to the Dental College for further treatment procedures. The Interns got exposure to performing examination method and basic dental procedures and delivering health talks and demonstrating brushing technique in a rural setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management.





The department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University organized an oral health screening and treatment program on March 25, 2022 at Wazirabad village, Sec-52, Gurugram collaborating with Faculty of Medical Sciences, SGT University.

The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Charu Khurana (Assistant Professor), along with 4 postgraduate students- Dr. Isha, Dr. Nishtha, Dr. Sanjoli and Dr. Aishaan from different clinical departments Intern and 4 interns- Meera, Manisha, Neha and Ranika and 2 Attendants (Mr. Rajkumar and Mr. Sunil). The dental camp started at 11:00 am and continued till 2:00 pm.

During the Outreach activity, Oral health status of 42 villagers was examined. The team imparted the importance of oral health, routine oral hygiene instructions to them and also demonstrated brushing techniques. Around 21 patients were provided oral prophylaxis in the mobile dental van. All the Villagers expressed gratitude for the visit and pledged to take care of their oral hygiene habits in future.

The dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Head of Department & Associate Dean). A total of 11 patients including 5 males and 6 females were examined. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT Dental Hospital for further procedures. Total people examined: 11 out of which 5 were males and 6 were females. 11 patients were referred to SGT dental hospital for their treatment. Majority of the patients had periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis & dental caries



#### 7. Objective of the Activity:

To create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health, provide oral health check-up and referral of complex treatment cases to SGT Dental Hospital.

#### 8. <u>Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities undertaken</u>

An oral health screening and treatment camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University on 5<sup>TH</sup> April 2022 at village Garhi in association with SGT Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Tanvi Bhardwaj (Assistant Professor) along with 2 interns, Shubham and Kashika and 1 attendant, Mr. Sombir. Total 24 patients were examined and patients who required dental treatment were referred to SGT University. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave a positive feedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were content with the screening service provided in the camp. The interns appreciated the opportunity provided to them to work in an outreach location and expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future.

#### 9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents of Garhi village, from old age groups with a few children. The working population is primarily engaged in service. Twenty four people including four children, came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 13 were males and 11 were females. Both adults and children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had dental caries and periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Many old-aged people complained about missing teeth and were willing to get replaced with prosthesis. A wide percentage of the people (both men and women), reported as tobacco users, mainly bidi and hukka smokers, who were separately motivated for quitting the habit .

10. Outcome of the Activity & its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the people of Garhi Village. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate the population regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance, which created an interest among the population, especially children. Twenty four patients were examined and were motivated to get the required treatment done from SGT Dental College and Hospital. Nine patients reported to the Dental College for further treatment procedures. The Interns got exposure to performing examination method and delivering health talks and demonstrating brushing technique in a rural setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management.





Of which 24 patients were provided treatment (20 oral prophylaxis, 1 restoration, 3 extractions) in Mobile Dental Van on camp site. Patients who required complex treatment were referred to Dental Hospital in SGT University. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated to both adult and child patients. The general population gave positive feedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were appreciative of the oral health education and counselling disseminated to them. The interns and postgraduates appreciated the opportunity provided to them to interact with patients at a community setting leading to improvement in their soft skills and approach towards patients in an outreach location, they also expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future. #### 7. Objective of the Activity:

To sensitize the population regarding importance of oral health

To provide oral health checkup for the population and educate them regarding their oral health status

To provide basic treatment at the camp site to provide immediate care to the patients

To motivate the population to avail advanced oral health services being offered at Faculty of Dental Sciences

#### 8. Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities undertaken

An oral health screening and treatment camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2022 (Sunday) at Essel towers MG Road, Gurugram in association with SGTU Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Abhinav Bhargava (Assistant Professor, Department of PHD and Dr Ajay Associate Professor (Department of Oral Surgery) along with 2 postgraduates Dr. Karuna (Pedodontics) Dr Tanishka (Prosthodontics) and 4 interns- Geetanjali, Elakshi, Pooja Verma, Shruti and 2 attendants Mr. Sunil and Mr Rajkumar A total of 33 patients were examined of which 13 patients were provided treatment



(13 Oral Prophylaxis) in Mobile Dental Van on camp site. Patients who required complex treatment were referred to Dental Hospital in SGT University. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated to all the patients. Mouthwash and toothpaste were distributed to the patients according to their oral health needs. The general population gave positive feedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were appreciative of the oral health education and counselling disseminated to them. The interns and postgraduates appreciated the opportunity provided to them to interact with patients at a community setting leading to improvement in their soft skills and approach towards patients in an outreach location, they also expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future. The purpose of the dental camp was to create awareness in the community towards the importance of oral health.

#### 9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents and support staff of Essel Towers MG Road Gurugram from all age groups. The working population is primarily engaged in Service sector and businesses. 33 people came forward for their Dental Check including both males and females. 13 were provided basic treatment. Patients were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Younger population had Dental Caries Predominantly. A fragment of population was of tobacco chewers who were separately motivated for quitting the habit. Mouthwashes and toothpastes were distributed as per the oral health needs of the population

#### 10. Outcome of the Activity & its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the people of all age groups. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate the population regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance. Thirty Three patients were examined and thirteen were given basic treatment at the camp site. The villagers were satisfied with the diagnostic and treatment services provided at the camp and were convinced to avail advanced treatment procedures at the Faculty of Dental Sciences. The Interns Post graduates worked in Tandem and learnt the nuances of working at a rural setting in a mobile setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management at a rural setting


