- 6. Objective of the Activity: To create awareness among the school students about common oral diseases and to Promote Dental Health.
- 7. Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities undertaken: The Department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University conducted Oral health screening and Treatment program on 29th April 2022 at S B Packagings, Sampla Village, Gurugram. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr Meenakshi Chopra (Associate Professor) along 3 Postgraduates Dr Komal (Prosthodontics), Dr Sapna (Endodontics), Dr. Shruti (Oral Medicine and Radiology) and 4 Interns Isha, Gunjan, Saksham and Lakshay Tuteja) and 2 attendants Mr Sunil and Mr Sombir. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Prosthodontics, and Endodontics and Oral Medicine and Radiology. 225 patients were examined out of which were provided dental treatment in the mobile dental van (44 Oral Prophylaxis, 2 Restoration). Toothpaste & mouthwash samples were distributed to the patients. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University for further procedures. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave positive feedback and appreciated the check up and patient care provided by the Dental Team. The purpose of the Oral Health check-up was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health.

3 patients were diagnosed with Malocclusion





8. Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities <u>undertaken</u>

An oral health screening and treatment camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University on 30th April 2022 at SB Packagings Pvt Ltd, Sampla in order to celebrate International Labour Day. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Tanvi Bhardwaj (Assistant Professor) along with three post-graduate students, Dr. Mehak (Periodontics), Dr. Tarshit (Conservative and Endodontics), Dr. Sugandha (Pedodontics), 5 interns, Ishu, Jyoti, Gunjan, Lakshay, Saksham and 2 attendants, Mr. Sunil and Mr. Rajkumar. Total 244 patients were examined and 62 patients were treated in Mobile Dental Van, SGT University which included 60 scalings and 2 restoration. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave a positive feedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were content with the treatment provided in the camp. The interns and other dental specialists appreciated the opportunity provided to them to work in an outreach location and expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future.

9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were workers of SB Packagings Pvt. Ltd. Factory in Sampla from young adults and middle age group. The working population is primarily engaged in Manufacturing labour. Total 244 were examined out of which 20 were females. All the workers were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had dental caries and periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis.

10. Outcome of the Activity & its relevance to Health Sciences:



The activity was well appreciated by the workers of SB Packagings. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate them regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance, which created an interest among the population. Two hundred and forty four patients were examined and sixty two patients were treated in the mobile dental van and others were motivated to get the required treatment done from SGT Dental College and Hospital. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Conservative and Endodontics, Periodontics and Pedodontics. The Interns got exposure to performing examination method and basic dental procedures and delivering health talks and demonstrating brushing technique in a service setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management.


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

The Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University conducted oral health screening and treatment program on 2nd May 2022 at SB Packagings, Sampla, Rohtak to celebrate the International Labour Day which is observed each year on the first day of May to celebrate the achievements of the working class. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Head of Dept & Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Sachin Chand (Department of Public Health Dentistry) along with Dr Nishtha (Postgraduate Periodontology), Dr Sarojini (Postgraduate Prosthodontics), Interns Paominthang T, Joyshree, Yogesh, Aksa, Akanksha D, Techi, Himanshi and attendant Mr. Sunil and Mr Sombir. A total of 131 patients including 118 males and 13 females were examined. Out of which 64 patients were provided treatment in mobile dental van which includes 62 oral prophylaxis, 8 permanent restorations and 1 extraction. Total people examined: 131 out of which 118 were males and 13 were females. 64 were provided treatment in the mobile dental van. Majority of the patients had periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis & dental caries

10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the workers of SB Packagings, Sampla, Rohtak. 131 people were examined out of which 64 were given treatment in mobile dental van. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT dental hospital for further procedures The Interns and Post graduates worked in tandem and learnt the nuances of working at a industrial setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management at a urban (industrial) oral health programme

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

The Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University conducted oral health screening and treatment program on 3rd May 2022 at SB Packagings, Sampla, Rohtak to celebrate the International Labour Day which is observed each year on the first day of May . The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Head of Dept & Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr.Abhinav Bhargava (Department of Public Health Dentistry) along with Dr Divanshi (Postgraduate Oral Surgery), Dr (Postgraduate Endodontics) and Dr Sugandha (Post Graduate Arijit Pedodontics) and Interns Geetanjali Pooja Verma Priyanka Shruti Yadav and Preeti Yadav and attendant Mr. Sunil and Mr Sombir. Specialist Clinical Support was given by Department of Pedodontics Oral Surgery and Endodontics . A total of 137 patients including 134 males and 3 females were examined. They acknowledged the way the dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion. The purpose of the Oral Health check-up was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health.

The Beneficiaries were employees of SB Packaging Sampla Haryana between the age groups of 18 and 50 years. The working population is primarily engaged in packaging material preparation. 137 people came forward for their Dental Check including 134 males and 3 females. 49 were provided basic treatment. Patients were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had periodontal problems including



gingivitis and periodontitis A fragment of population was of tobacco chewers who were separately motivated for quitting the habit. Mouthwashes and toothpastes were distributed as per the oral health needs of the population
