World Oral Health Day 2022 campaign kicked off with a theme on 'Be Proud of Your Mouth' for your happiness and well-being and encourages everyone to get involved.

World Oral Health Day (WOHD) is a global observance day celebrated every year on 20th March with a motive to raise awareness of oral health and prevention of oral diseases. FDI World Dental Federation launched this day in 2013 as a flagship forum to discuss and talk about dental care and oral hygiene all over around the world.

SGT Dental College, Hospital and Research Institute, SGT University, Gurugram observed WOHD with a series of outreach activities on oral health promotion and awareness campaign from 26th February 2022 - 26th March 2022. The outreach programs were organized daily at different peripheral locations to accomplish the motto of FDI. The initiative has been taken up by Dr. Omkar Krishna Shetty (Dean, Faculty of Dental Sciences) and Dr. Shourya Tandon (Associate Dean, Faculty of Dental Sciences) and SGT Publicity team. The camps included, dental check-up, talks on importance of oral health, oral hygiene instructions, ill effects of tobacco consumption, demonstration of skills for using different oral hygiene aids, distribution of IEC materials and performance of skits/street play by dental students. All the dental patients were provided treatment in the Mobile Dental Van and referred to SGT Dental Hospital for further complex dental procedures if required.

Apart from the outreach activities, In-campus of the University, all the employees (Teaching and Non teaching) were motivated to come forward for their dental check up and learn essential oral hygiene routine during the WOHD week. Expert talks by specialists clinical departments are also being organized.

Dental faculty members, Postgraduate students and undergraduates of the faculty were all involved in these activities to make World Oral Health Day 2022 a huge success.



The department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University organized an oral health screening and treatment program on February 15, 2022 at RD International School, Rohini, Delhi collaborating with Faculty of Nursing, SGT University.

The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Charu Khurana (Assistant Professor), along with 2 postgraduate students- Dr. Rini and Dr. Shefali from pedodontics department Intern and 4 interns- prapti, Meera, preeti and prerna and 1 Attendant (Mr. Rajkumar). The dental camp started at 11:00 am and continued till 1:30 pm.

During the Outreach activity, Oral health status of school children and teachers were examined. The team imparted the importance of oral health, routine oral hygiene instructions to them and also demonstrated brushing techniques. Around 14 children were provided treatment including 12 scalings and 4 restorations. Dental team also made children aware about National Science Day 2022 and inform them about integrated approach of science and technology in health.

Children, teachers and supporting staff expressed gratitude for the visit and pledged to take care of their oral hygiene habits in future.



To provide oral health checkup for the population and educate them regarding their oral health status

To provide basic treatment at the camp site to provide immediate care to the patients

To motivate the population to avail advanced oral health services being offered at Faculty of Dental Sciences

8. <u>Brief Write-up (300 -500 words) on the event(s)explaining activities</u> <u>undertaken</u>

The Department of Public Health Dentistry of Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University conducted oral health screening and treatment program on 27th February 2022 at CPS School Ashok Vihar Phase 3 in association with SGT Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr Abhinav Bhargava (Assistant Professor) along with 1 faculty Dr Ajay (Oral Surgery) 2 Postgraduates Dr Virtika (Prosthodontics) , Dr Kevin (Periodontics) and 6 Interns Meera , Elakshi , Akhil , Anshu , Sonu and Manisha) and 2 attendants Mr Sunil and Mr Rajkumar . Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Prosthodontics, Periodontics and Oral Surgery. 74 patients were examined out of which 30 were provided dental treatment in the mobile dental van (30 Oral Prophylaxis). Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University for further procedures. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave positive feedback and appreciated



the check up and patient care provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion The interns and postgraduates appreciated the opportunity provided to them to work in an outreach location and experiencing the working of mobile dental van and expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future. The purpose of the Oral Health check-up was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health.

9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents of Ashok Vihar Phase 3 from all age groups. The working population is primarily engaged in service sector and small-time businesses. 74 people came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 44 males and 30 were females. Thirty were provided basic treatment. Children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Younger population had Dental Caries Predominantly. A fragment of population was of tobacco chewers who were separately motivated for quitting the habit.






An oral health screening and treatment camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University on 2ND March 2022 at village Kherla, Sohna in association with SGT Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Tanvi Bhardwaj(Assistant Professor) along with one faculty, Dr. Raghuvendra (Conservative and Endodontics), two post-graduate students, Dr. Megha (Periodontics) and Dr. Prabodh (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery), 5 interns, Neha Thakur, Pooja Verma, Pooja Yadav, Preeti and Priyanka and 2 attendants, Mr. Sunil and Mr. Rajkumar. Total 56 patients were examined and 18 patients were treated in Mobile Dental Van, SGT University which included 14 scalings, 2 restorations and 2 extractions. Patients who required complex dental treatment were referred to SGT University. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated. The general population gave a positivefeedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were content with the treatment provided in the camp. The interns and other dental specialists appreciated the opportunity provided to them to work in an outreach location and expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future.

9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents of Kherla village, Sohna from all age groups. The working population is primarily engaged in agriculture. Fifty sixpeople including seven children, came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 29 were males and 27 were females. Both adults and children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had dental caries and periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Many old-aged people complained about missing teeth and were willing to get replaced with prosthesis. A few of the people (both men and women), reported astobacco users, who were separately motivated for quitting the habit .



10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the people of Kherla Village. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate the population regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance, which created an interest among the population, especially children. Fifty-Six patients were examined and eighteen patients were treated in the mobile dental van and others were motivated to get the required treatment done from SGT Dental College and Hospital. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Conservative and Endodontics, Periodontics and Oral Surgery.22 patients reported to the Dental College for further treatment procedures. The Interns got exposure to performing examination method and basic dental procedures and delivering health talks and demonstrating brushing technique in a rural setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management.







Department of Public Health Dentistry under the aegis of SGT Admission team conducted **schooloralhealth** check-up counselling and treatment programme on 6th March 2022 at Shishu Kalyan Senior Secondary School Sector 86 Nawada, Gurugram.

The activity coincided with National Dentist day and the Dental team did justice to this day by providing their specialist services to young students and their parents keeping in mind moral obligation and duty towards societal cause.

The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head). The Dental team was headed by Dr Ankita (tutor) Department of Public Health Dentistry and Dr Ajay (Associate Professor) Department of Oral and maxillofacial surgery along with 2 Postgraduates Dr Tabita (Pedodontics) and Dr Mehak Khajuria (Periodontics) and 4 Interns (Manisha, Meera Anshu and Sonu) and 2 Attendants Mr Sunil and MrSombir. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Oral Surgery, Pedodontics and Periodontics. The camp started at 10:30 am and continued till 2:00 pm. 66 patients including 29 children and their parents and guardians were examined. 19 patients (19 oral



prophylaxis) were given basic oral health care in the mobile dental van.

Oral Health Education was imparted regarding the importance of adopting a healthy lifestyle through brushing techniques, models and charts. The young children were shown educational videos in the mobile dental van to inculcate good oral health habits. The session was concluded by giving oral health education to the students, parents and teachers. The purpose of the Oral Health talk was to create awareness among the community and make them understand the importance of oral health care. Patients who required dental treatment were referred to SGT Dental hospital for further treatment.

The working population is primarily engaged inService sector and business ventures.66 people came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 29 were children. Nineteen were provided basic treatment. Children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had problems like gingivitis and periodontitis. Younger population had Dental Caries Predominantly.

9. Number & Description of Beneficiaries:

The Beneficiaries were residents of Aklimpur village, Gurugram, from all age groups. The working population is primarily engaged in service. Fifty Nine people including eleven children, came forward for their Dental Check up out of which 20 were males and 39 were females. Both adults and children were given demonstration for brushing technique. Majority of the patients had dental caries and periodontal problems including gingivitis and periodontitis. Many old-aged people complained about missing teeth and were willing to get replaced with prosthesis. Children reported with dental caries and orthodontic issues. A few patients were tobacco consumers and were given cessation counselling.



10. Outcome of the Activity& its relevance to Health Sciences:

The activity was well appreciated by the people of Aklimpur Village. Proper brushing technique was demonstrated to educate the population regarding importance of proper oral hygiene maintenance, which created an interest among the population, especially children. Tobacco Cessation Counselling was given to tobacco users. Fifty Nine patients were examined andnineteen patients were treated in the mobile dental van and others were motivated to get the required treatment done from SGT Dental College and Hospital. Specialist Clinical support was provided by Department of Conservative and Endodontics, Pedodontics, Prosthodontics and Oral Surgery.15 patients reported to the Dental College for further treatment procedures. The Interns got exposure to performing examination method and basic dental procedures and delivering health talks and demonstrating brushing technique in a rural setting while realizing the importance of good teamwork and soft skills related to patient management.

The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head). The Dental team was headed by Dr. Charu Khurana (Assistant Professor), along with 4 postgraduate students- Dr. Isha, Dr. Nishtha, Dr. Sanjoli and Dr. Aishaan from different clinical departments Intern and 4 interns- Meera, Manisha, Neha and Ranika and 2 Attendants (Mr. Rajkumar and Mr. Sunil). The dental camp started at 11:00 am and continued till 2:00 pm.

During the Outreach activity, Oral health status of 42 villagers was examined. The team imparted the importance of oral health, routine oral hygiene instructions to them and also demonstrated brushing techniques. DENTAL CAMP REPORT

Camp Location: Patauda, Gurugram

26th March 2022

An oral health screening and treatment camp was organized by Department of Public Health Dentistry, Faculty of Dental Sciences, SGT University on 26th March 2022 (Saturday) at Patauda Village, Gurugram in association with Medical fraternity and SGTU Publicity Team. The Dental team took initiative under the guidance of Dr. Shourya Tandon (Prof. & Head and Associate Dean) to celebrate the World Oral Health Week and World Tuberculosis Day, 2022. The Dental team was headed by Dr. Meenakshi Chopra (Associate Professor, PHD department), and Dr. Mohit Sharma (Professor, Oral Pathology and Microbiology) along with 2 postgraduates Dr. Rachana Negi (Oral Medicine and Radiology), Dr. Harender (Periodontics) and 4 Interns- Prapti, Prerna, Vinamr, Nikhil and 2 attendants -Mr. Sunil and Mr. Sombir from PHD department) and a team of interns (Atibha, Mahima, Udita, Manya, Mallika, Akshita, Gunjan, Nayanika, Ridhima, Shraddha, Elakshi) to perform street play. A total of 31 patients were examined which included 21 males and 10 females. Of which 14 patients were provided treatment (12 oral prophylaxis, 1 restoration, 1 extraction) in Mobile Dental Van on camp site. Patients who required complex treatment were referred to Dental Hospital in SGT University. Interns performed street play to educate people about Tuberculosis and need to comply with drug regimen to cure the disease. Oral health education was imparted to the people and proper brushing technique was demonstrated to both adult and child patients. The general population gave a positive feedback and appreciated the check up and treatment provided by the Dental Team. They acknowledged the way the Dental team heard and attended to their problems with compassion and were appreciative of the oral health education and counselling disseminated to them. The interns appreciated the opportunity provided to them to interact with patients at a community setting leading to improvement in their soft skills and approach towards patients in an outreach location, they also expressed their wish to participate in such activities in the future. The purpose of the dental camp was to promote the World Oral Health Days and World Tuberculosis Day, 2022 and create awareness in the community towards the importance of oral health.


